Define which business needs digital tools could support

Actions:

Remind yourself of business priorities by looking at goals and your vision for success.

Choose a key challenge based on how many staff it affects or urgency to solve, and work back towards the root cause of the problem.

• Suggested duration: 10 days

• Why this will help: It's crucial to identify the root cause of a problem before you start searching for the solution.

Talk to leaders in your network to find out how they solved a similar problem and, if they used technology, what tools worked for them.

• Impact: Medium

• Suggested duration: 20 days

• Why this will help: Speaking to peers, mentors or experts will broaden your understanding of what's possible. Take time to learn about people's experiences and then follow up with your own research.

• Why this will help: Your research should help you make an informed decision about whether digital tools can support your business needs.
